



The Humane Society of Greene County in Waynesburg is the recipient of a much-needed storage shed on its shelter property. The team effort began last September at a Greene County Chamber of Commerce membership luncheon. Representatives of the Humane Society, Greene County Career and Technology Center and Blueprints, with funding from the Pennsylvania Office of Vocational Rehabilitation, and the Challenge Program, met and discussed the shed project for the first time. The effort received a \$5,000 grant from the Dominion Energy Charitable Foundation, which was used to pay for supplies. Blueprints paid students from the Career and Technology Center to build the shed through a Work-Based Learning Experience. Sherwin-Williams donated the paint.
